BE; DO; HAVE: Planning the Best Music for Your Parish

The main focus and purpose of this workshop is to present a simple and practical approach for parishes to take action in creating a unified and organized parish music program that considers the vision, needs, and assets of the individual parish. It employs the use of three verbs (do, be, and have) to explore, identify, and organize the elements necessary for a unified, vital, and dynamic church music program. It is an approach that may be taken by a parish on its own or with the assistance of the Music Ministry.

BE

DO

What must a parish BE in order to have a strong and vital music program? They must be UNIFIED in vision, ORGANIZED, OBJECTIVE, PATIENT, and PERSISTENT.

What must a parish DO in order to BE unified, organized, objective, and patient? They must PLAN, beginning with the unified

vision. Specific goals and objectives will begin to surface, and the next best one to two steps, can be discovered. A reasonable time line can be established, and goals and objectives can be identified as "good," "better," and "best." This is an ACTION-CENTERED plan, rather than an abstract plan.

What must a parish HAVE in order to patiently carry out this unified, organized, objective vision? They must determine if they HAVE the concrete facilities/materials (What), methods (How), and people (Who) to take the next identified steps toward the goals and objectives. If not, this will make it clear what the next action should be or if the plan must be re-evaluated.
