During the summer, you can observe the Northern Cardinal, Tufted Titmouse, Carolina Chickadee, Carolina Wren, American Crow, Blue Jay, Red-bellied Woodpecker, Downy Woodpecker, Cedar Waxwing, many varieties of brilliantly colored Warblers, as well as New Jersey's state bird, the American Goldfinch. With expert assistance, we'll learn how to spot, identify and appreciate these sweet-tempered and fine-feathered creatures and, discover how they build habitats for other animals, and likewise, keep the forests healthy by spreading spores and seeds.

A limited number of binoculars will be made available, however, guests are encouraged to bring their own. The tour lasts about one hour and fifteen minutes and comfortable shoes, bug spray and a water bottle are recommended. Children welcome.
