

Description:

The Adult Education Program (AEP) is comprised of three tracks, Modern Greek, New Testament Greek and Ancient Greek. Courses within each track have been developed to meet the needs of adult Greek Language Learners as they enter their journey of Greek Language Acquisition at the Beginner basic literacy stage, moving forward to the Intermediate Level, then seeking to achieve fluency at the Advanced Level, and finally reaching complete communicative Proficiency.

Courses at the beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels are offered during the academic year, depending on enrollment. Coursework is easy-paced, driven by placement evaluations, progress assessments, and participative pedagogical methodologies that are designed to enhance key Second Language Acquisition skills, including: Vocabulary development, pronunciation and intonation, listening comprehension, speaking, reading, writing, grammar usage, and cultural education. Students progressively acquire the Greek Language in a classroom environment that is based on immersion, extensive practice on a variety of themes, and fully learner-focused interactive learning.

In addition to building authentic conversational competencies, Modern Greek courses are aimed at preparing students to succeed in passing examinations for the Certificate of Attainment in Greek at CEFR Levels A1, A2, B1, B2, Γ1. Γ2.

Substantive goals of New Testament Greek courses include the development of authentic vocabulary, reading, speaking, writing, and grammar skills that are systematically augmented as participants study and analyze selected New Testament passages and by completing helpful knowledge-building exercises. As students gradually acquire New Testament Greek, they also create exegetical competence which leads to a deeper level of comprehension of scriptural text.

The curriculum for Ancient Greek is based on established academic standards that focus not only on building vocabulary and syntactical skills but also cultivating the ability of learners to read, comprehend and enjoy the depth, morphology and character of selected Classical Greek literary treasures that continue to define Western Civilization.
