
"The Parables"

In Loving Memory of Fay Kolster, An Original Founding Member of OCWA April 2, 1932 – October 13, 2022

Where does one begin to try to wrap up Fay Kolster's life? It is a monumental challenge due to the fact that she was so engaged and involved throughout her life of 90 purposeful years. She loved tap and ballet from little on, shined at performing on stage, and was on "pointe" by age 8. Fay grew up and worked alongside her brother at her parent's restaurant, The White Manor, on East Juneau in Milwaukee. By age 10 she learned, by following her parent's lead, about serving others at the restaurant and providing to those who couldn't afford food during WWII and lean economic times. She, all on her own, organized a yearly tea and lunch for a local orphanage as a young girl. No wonder she was so good at hosting us all throughout her life. Her love of children led her to major in Child Development and she taught nursery, preschool, Sunday school, and even college students at MATC. One of her challenging endeavors, (but she would say, "most rewarding") was leading the Annunciation teenage youth groups by bus- to summer church camp in Cheyenne, Wyoming each summer. She would say she learned as much about life as the campers did. When she wasn't

teaching, she was involved with community fundraisers, and several Bible studies, (often 3 per week). She served on the board of AGLOW, led the area as President of the Milwaukee chapter of the League of Women Voters (1969), and even threw her hat in the ring one year to run for Alderperson in her community. Fay never let a challenge deter her and always fought for a cause to make the community stronger and better for everyone, all while raising 3 active boys with her husband, Tom. She loved working with the underserved and often would be organizing dinners and clothing/ household donations for missions and community groups in her area. Her love of the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church and the Orthodox community entwined her with many different groups throughout the years. When she wasn't co-chairing the Festival chicken dinner tent, leading church visitors on educational tours, working in the bookstore, organizing the yearly rummage, and fostering the church community book Along the Way I & II, you would find her participating in the OCWA- an organization near and dear to her heart. She was on the Steering Committee that started the OCWA over 25 years ago and was ever so proud of the growing and dedicated mission of the members and the values of living our faith through unity and service. While she not only enjoyed organizing various projects like retreats, luncheons, and the OCWA prayer book, she loved partaking in the ministry's events alongside her friends. Father Ciprian said it best: "Fay not only engaged, but she was also particularly good at engaging others along the way." On any given day when you would ask Fay how she was, she would reply with a sweet smile and say, "I am Thankful.". May we all have a little bit of Fay in our lives as we find the Thankful in each and every day. May her memory be eternal.
