## THEOLO-TWEET

We come to church on Sundays to receive Christ. We receive Christ with all our senses; we hear the Gospel lesson (which translated from the Greek means the Good News), we see and touch the icons, we smell the sweet-smelling incense, and we “taste and see how good the Lord is” by taking communion. Of all of our senses, partaking in the Eucharist is the most important thing we do, because we receive Christ into ourselves to become one with Him. The Eucharist is the central act of the Church – it is the central act of how we practice our faith.

But being a Christian means more than just coming to Church on Sundays. What we receive is not meant to be kept to ourselves. The rest of the week, when we leave the church and go to school and work, we should share what we have received. The people we encounter should be coming into contact with someone who has received Christ. As much as we receive Christ, that much more we should share with others. Just like all of our senses are stimulated in church, all parts of our being should emulate a Christian interaction. Sharing Christ with others is how we live our faith.
