Kontakion of Meeting of our Lord: 1st Tone (Jan. 14 - Feb. 9)

For our salvation You took flesh and You sanctified the Virgin's womb; You blessed the aged Symeon as You lay resting in his arms; and having come to save us all, O Christ our God, to these troubled times, bring Your lasting peace.
