Hospital Visitations

Since hospitals are no longer permitted to provide me with admittance information of our Orthodox Parishioners, please consider the scenarios below:

Scheduled Hospital Procedures – Please come to Divine Liturgy and receive Holy Communion and Holy Unction prior to your procedure. If you are unable to attend Divine Liturgy during a Sunday and weekday service, please contact me in order to receive Holy Communion and Holy Unction in your home or nursing home prior to your procedure. Please let me know if you would like for me to visit you while you are in the hospital or in your home convalescing. Know that I will have you in my prayers!

Note for Expectant Mothers – The Orthodox Church offers prayers for mothers on the day that they deliver a child, for the child's naming on the eighth day and on the fortieth day when the mother and child come into the Church.

Unscheduled Hospital Procedures – If you are unable to contact me, please have a family member or friend contact me to arrange a visitation. I will need to know the patient's full legal name, hospital name, hospital location, and patient room number.

Home / Nursing Home Visitations

For our parishioners who have ailments making it difficult for them to come to Church, please call me to arrange a time for me to visit with you in your home or nursing home.

House Blessing – Please contact me to have your home blessed. Traditionally, we offer this following the Feast day of Epiphany (January 6th) through the month of January and into February, but it can be done any time of the year.

On the Passing of a Beloved One

Please contact me if a loved one's health is in decline, so I can meet and offer prayers for them. On the day of a loved one's passing please contact me as soon as possible, so I can offer Trisagion prayers bedside before they move your loved one from their hospital or nursing home room.
