Another year of school is about to begin, and our youth ministries are also preparing. There will be some changes. Please take note. Use the form above to register your children so program advisors can properly prepare. Return it to the pangari or Lisa Nicolaou thru the above email or address given.

**Sunday School** helps strengthen our children's relationship with our Lord and Savior and their understanding of the Orthodox faith. They will learn about Saints, what is happening during Liturgy, fasting and its importance, Orthodox culture and traditions, and much more. It is for students K-12. We currently have teachers to split the children by grade level. If we have enough students we would like to do grades K-3, 4-6, 7-12. The time of Sunday School has changed.

Beginning **September 8th grades 4-6** will continue to meet at **9:15am** and will meet in the Sunday school rooms and come to church at 10 and sit with family. **Grades K-3 and 7-12 will begin at 11:45.** After communion they will sit on the left of the church, in the white pews. and teachers will escort them to the church hall for snack and class.

**GOYA** (Greek Orthodox Youth of America) is a youth ministry for 7th-12th graders. It helps strengthen our youth's faith and sense of community and family. There are monthly meetings, either virtual or held at the church hall after Divine Liturgy. In addition to meetings they are learning and integrating the four elements of Orthodox youth (Worship, Service, Fellowship, Witness) they do this through fundraisers, volunteer work (that can count for school), both for the church and community, camp and much more. **HOPE** (grades K-3) and **JOY** (grades 4-6) are youth ministries that help strengthen our youngest children's faith and sense of community and family at their levels. They learn and integrate the four elements of Orthodox youth (Worship, Service, Fellowship, Witness).
